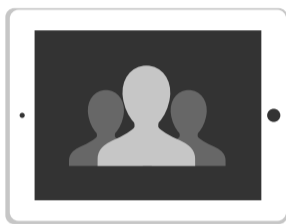

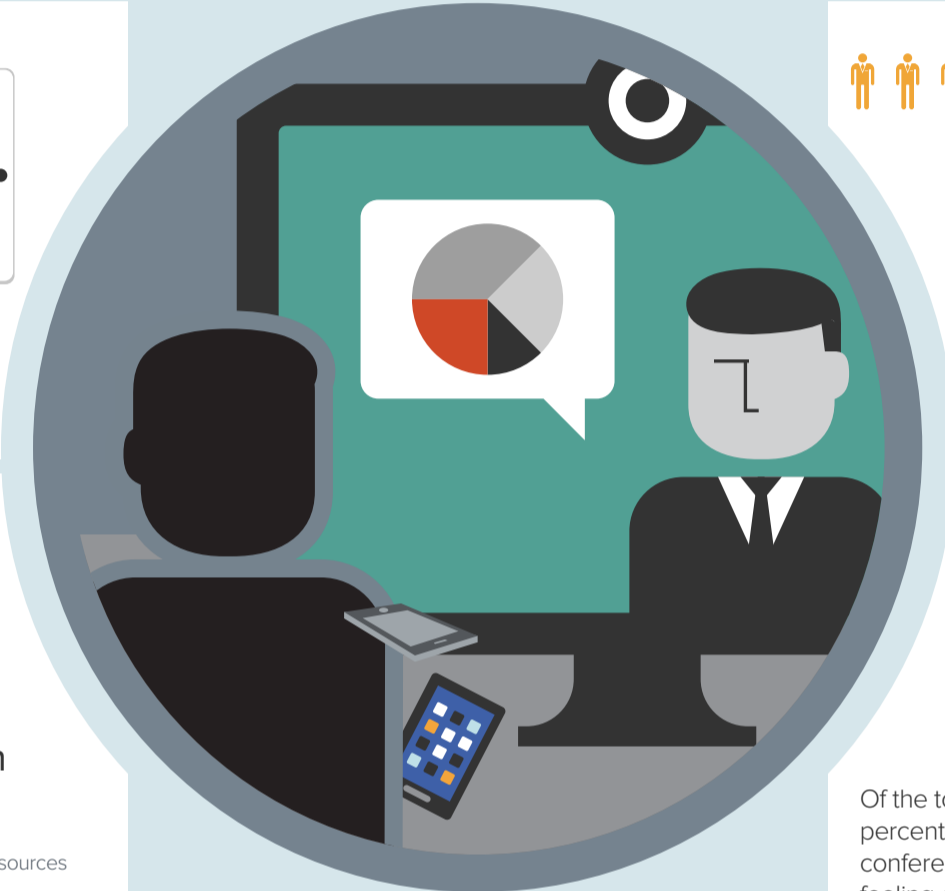
1.3 billion people will work remotely using mobile technology by 2015. That's 37.2% of the entire workforce.

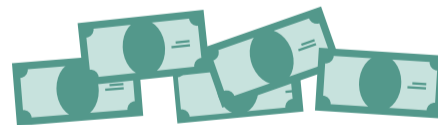
Mobile will soon encompass the whole spectrum of HR simply because it's becoming the most common way people access technology.
